







Happy Easter to Everyone

Everyone celebrates Easter in different ways. For some it is a very serious Church Festival (Good Friday being considered the most important event in the Church calendar.) It is also at the very end of Lent, so fish is the choice for a Good Friday lunch see Felicity's fish recipe inside.

Locally Good Friday will be celebrated by the churches coming together for a 'Walk of Witness' through town concluding at St Mary's Church (with hot cross buns.)

Easter Day marks the end of Lent and the chance to indulge especially if you have given up sweet things eggs were originally banned during lent as 'they originated from animals that provide us with flesh.' Hardboiled eggs often decorated with painted shells and ribbons were given as a treat at the end of Lent, eventually superseded by chocolate eggs.

Now it seems our chocolate egg may be under threat.

According to a new report called *Destruction by* Chocolate there could be a chocolate deficit of 100,000 tonnes a year in the near future.

The study found that the typical Western consumer eats 286 chocolate bars on average each year, requiring suppliers to plant 10 cocoa trees for every sweet-toothed person.

More than 90 per cent of the global cocoa crop is produced by smallholders or subsistence farms but farming techniques 'have not changed in hundreds of years'.

Perhaps we will soon be eating those decorated hard boiled eggs after all!

News from the Burton Art Gallery & Museum

March at the Gallery can be relied upon to cheer you up. The main ingredient for this happiness factor is the **Torridge** Schools Exhibition. What a glorious selection of artwork! Wall to wall, top to bottom, colour, design, brilliance, imagination, fills the eye. This year's must rank as one of the best ever seen. These works could grace any art gallery in the country, including London, and would receive accolade after accolade. The young people in our area, from nursery to Alevel, are so talented. The pencil drawings, in particular, are



exceptional. This exhibition of young people's work rivals any by grown-ups, and if they continue to paint, draw, sculpt, and create like this in their adult life, we shall never be short of craft or art for future exhibitions, wherever they are. N.A.D.F.A.S. (National Association of Decorative and Fine Arts) have supported this event once again, and have awarded prizes for merit, donating cash to the three schools and to certain chosen students. The teachers are also to be congratulated for inspiring such work in their pupils. The exhibition runs until **14**th **March**, and it's certain that those pupils whose work is on show will have proud parents who will treasure the artwork in their children's personal archive.

But in the next room, you will find a complete contrast. Against the white walls, Philip Eglin's 'Slipping the Trail' concentrates on less colour. In fact, brown, white and yellow dominate this collection of boldly decorated ceramics. Occasionally, he is inspired to write a short recipe for 'Cawl' on a plate, or mention his favourite dessert, 'jam roly poly'. He sometimes uses his sons' early drawings on his pots, and perhaps the 'Cowboy' and the 'Indian' come under that category! You can enjoy this exhibition for its quirkiness, its eccentricity, and its defiance of symmetry. A strong sense of humour prevails throughout, and it is truly said that he never takes himself too seriously. He borrows ideas from Hogarth, designers of Delft ware, the Arts & Crafts Movement,

Philip was born in 1959 in Gibraltar, and studied at Staffordshire Polytechnic and the Royal College of Art. He has won the Jerwood Prize for Applied Arts, and in 1993 was awarded an Arts Foundation Fellowship. He has exhibited in London, Scotland, New York, France, Denmark Germany and Taiwan, a thoroughly international artist. You can see his work in gallery 2 until 28th March, and there is a catalogue of his work available in the Gallery Shop.

Vicky Lindo worked in the Gallery for many years, managing the Shop and Craft Gallery, but all the while was designing and making embroidered textiles in her spare time. She became well known for her love of cats, which usually featured on her wall-hangings, samplers and cushions. Since leaving Vicky has set up her own studio and now produces earthenware decorative ceramics inspired by Bideford's slipware pottery heritage. She loves animals, plants and amusing incidents, which feature in her pottery. There is much humour in her work, which you can enjoy from 5th March to 30th April in the Craft Gallery.

The Cafe du Parc has been completely redecorated and refurbished, and looks really welcoming, and that new window on to the Park is just what was needed.



Mothering Sunday or Mother's Day?

In this country, Mothering Sunday/Mother's Day always falls on the fourth Sunday in Lent. Originally, in Elizabethan times, when church observance was much stricter than it is now, the custom was for people to return to their mother church once a year at this time. By Victorian times, this had developed into the custom whereby young people who worked as servants, and had very little opportunity to visit their families, were allowed home to visit them for the day. However, as the Industrial Revolution progressed, social habits changed, and Mothering Sunday, although still part of the Church of England calendar, faded into insignificance.

In the United States, however, a lady called Anna Jarvis held a church service in memory of her own mother, who had done a lot of work during the Civil War to help wounded soldiers on both sides of the conflict, and from this she developed the idea of Mother's Day. She then went on, after some opposition, to persuade the American government to make Mother's Day a national holiday, and in 1914, this came about, to be held on the second Sunday in May to honour mothers. It became a huge commercial success, which Anna Jarvis deeply regretted, attempting to get the law rescinded, and on one occasion was arrested for breach of the peace, for trying to break up a carnation-selling convention.

When American soldiers came to the UK during the Second World War, they brought the American concept of Mother's Day with them. This gave Mothering Sunday a new lease of life, although we today tend to emphasise the commercial rather than the religious aspects.

To be truthful, mothers have been celebrated throughout history, and all over the world, and the popularity of the day indicates in what high regard mothers are held; as Anna Jarvis put it: "the person who has done more for you than anyone in the world".

Tray Bake Skate Wing

Skate has a wonderful sweet tasting flesh with a subtle flavour. The bones are flat and glutinous and the flesh should be scraped from the bones from the thick side down to the thin edge. Some people eat all the flat cartilage bones! A good dish to share with friends for Easter or a simple Good Friday lunch.

Ingredients-serves 2 (add extra small /medium skate wings for extra servings.)

2 medium size skate wings

Splash of olive oil

Salt and peeper

19 baby plum tomatoes

- 2 tablespoons mini capers or chopped capers
- 2 tablespoon chopped parsley
- 2 tablespoon chopped oregano

Method

- 1 Whole bulb of garlic
- 2.Cut the tomatoes in half and sprinkle over the fish and add the capers and herbs.
- 3.Brush the bulb of garlic with the side of the knife, leaving the skin on
- 4.Add the fish with a good splash of white wine and a little more olive oil
- 5.Bake in the oven at 180 /gas mark 6 or in the centre of a solid fuel cooker for 20 mins
- 6. The flesh will come away from the central cartilage when the fish is cooked. 7. Serve with crusty bread.

Skate is on the red MSC (Marine Conservation Society) sustainable fish list. However, there are several types of skate and on the whole the local Skate wings bought from local sources will be the sustainable type.



The Power of Speech

Community Network..social chatting on the telephone for those who feel isolated..could YOU help? What a long wet winter! I have felt quite 'stuck' indoors, compounded by not having telephone or broadband connections for several weeks in December and January. Add to that the closure of the main road out of North Devon also for many weeks and it is not surprising I felt cut off from the outside world. But at least I can get to discussion groups in the library or U3A,..not everyone can do this.

A recent headline newspaper article and a television programme highlighted the fact that over a million people in the UK feel chronically lonely most or all of the time. Feelings of isolation can be triggered by life events such as bereavement, illness or disability, redundancy or relationship breakdown. People may not be living alone, but how many of us *really* listen to each other in this busy world?

Silverline is a well known charity which arranges regular telephone calls to older people, but did you know there are chat *groups* too? If you are not yet in that age group but feel a bit out of it sometimes, you could train to lead a group; it is called 'facilitating' and you learn how to keep a group discussion going without it getting out of hand..it can be informative and enjoyable and you would be helping others as well as broadening your personal horizons. The training is done on the telephone so you don't have to go out. It is prof essionally run, free ...and fun! It is run by a marvellous organisation called **Community Network**, based in London, which also provides conference call training for organisations such as charities.

I am heartened to learn that in an age of texts, tweets and e-mails people still value the warmth and varied inflections of the human voice, with its myriad expressions and even the silent pauses while we consider something that has been said. I for one find it difficult to really express how I feel or what I mean with text or e-mail, (just how many times can a smiley face emotion be used?!) And if you have eyesight problems everything is so much easier on the phone.

There was one old hand in the 'afternoon' of his working life (Fred will remember him) a shipwright in his younger days serving King and country who saw action at the River Plate aboard HMS Exeter . He had a number of repetitive catch phrases — 'it can't go on like this' the money's run out,' where is it all going to end.?' Then there was another shipwright of the same age who would more often than not break into song and sing his praises to the Lord for all the yard to hear :- ' it is not night while they are near.'

There is one piece of satire written on the toilet house wall 'thank goodness for the raft, just to say we have launched something.'

One shipwright went by the name of 'give us a fag'; as for me I was known at times as the' snorter king.'

Here at Buzz, we're compiling a list of youth opportunities to brighten up the post winter sting and, so far, many have materialised!

Either you learn of slight lifestyle changes to make, ensuring you take care of your blood pump, or (more likely) you're told that your blood pump can take care of you. Either way, it's good to check.

100 years ago - March 1916

The death has occurred in his 90th year of the Reverend Hudson G Heaven, whose family own Lundy Island. He had been parish priest on Lundy for 57 years. The cortege bearing his coffin embarked from Bideford on Captain Dark's skiff "The Gannet" for interment in the family vault on the island. He has been succeeded on the island by his son, Mr Walter Heaven.

At this time of the year the Gazette is full of seed merchant adverts, one local supplier being Messrs. Yeo & Son. Every kind of seed imaginable is on offer. On receipt of a Postal Order for 1/6d, the gardener will receive 10 packets of assorted vegetable seeds and 4 of flower seeds. As a bonus, they will also receive a packet of "Quite Content Peas", whose pods reach an extraordinary 7" in length, and one of "Red Giant Beans" which can grow pods 15-16" long.

At Tanton's Hotel, Mr A W Cock auctioned a s hop and premises in Bideford High Street, immediately adjoining the Post Office, together with 3 cottages in the rear giving a back entrance from Lower Gunstone. Bidding started at £1000 but the property was withdrawn at £1500.

In financial news, 4 original shares of £10 each for the Bideford Gas Company were purchased by Mr J Squire at £24 each. He also purchased 30 £5 shares in the Bideford Public Rooms Company Ltd at £2.12.6d each.

At the Bideford Town Council meeting the Lighting Committee reported that they had arranged to turn off a further 34 street lamps. In all 96 lamps have now been turned off which comprises about half of the public lamps in the town. Most of the grumbling had ceased and it was thought they might be able to put out a few more lamps.

Mr H R Bazeley questioned why a great deal of waste paper was found in the scavengers' carts. He felt it would be a benefit to the town if old paper could be repulped. At present much of it is burned on the river bank. These and many more items of local interest are available to read at the

FREE LIBRARY ASSAULT.

At Bideford Borough Sessions, yesterday, before the Mayor (Mr. T. Burton) in the cnair, Mrs. H. W. Fulford, Messrs. H. A. W. Huxham, F. E. Whiting, and J. Davis, Mr. Reuben Squires, an old gentleman, of Westcroft Terrace, Bideford, summoned James Potter, a Bideford mason, for assault on February 4th.—Defendant pleaded "Not guilty." Complainant said he was in Bideford Free Library when he saw defendant and another man point to the corner of the sporting news page of a newspaper and write something on a piece of paper.
